### Saying Goodbye to One of Our Own

CMBCL sadly learned of the passing of one of its first librarians in June.

Mary Jane Joyce began her work at Cedar Mill Library in 1980 shortly after she and her family moved to Oregon from Maryland. As a reference librarian, Mary Jane was known for her friendly, personalized service and her skill in building a print reference collection that was unusually comprehensive for a library of Cedar Mill's size. Through her 29 years at Cedar Mill Library, Mary Jane assisted tens of thousands of library users and helped many make the leap from the printed card catalog and books to accessing materials and information in online and digital formats.

Although she retired in 2009, her legacy of public service continues. Her family requests donations to Cedar Mill and Bethany Libraries. ### New Interpretation Services

Our community includes many who are not fluent in English. Service has been difficult as staff used intermediaries or phone apps to answer questions. WCCLS is now offering member libraries access to live language interpretation services. This service provides interpretation for in-person or over-the phone library services and makes libraries more accessible for those speaking languages other than English. Library staff are learning how to access this service and want our users to help spread the word to families and friends that language barriers to library service are being removed.

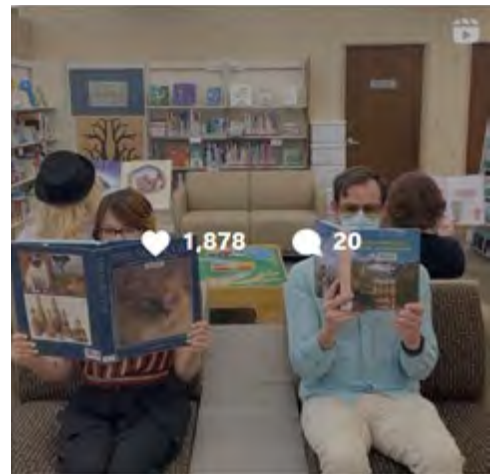

## Reading Success for Kids






CMBCL are your source for support in helping your child learn to read. From educational talks to booklists and resource-filled articles, your libraries offer a wealth of knowledge aimed at helping you give your child the best start in reading.



### Early Literacy

Early Literacy is what children know about reading and writing before they actually read or write.

**Six pre-reading skills** get children ready to learn how to read:

-  Talking is how children learn spoken language. They begin learning at birth.
-  Singing and rhyming help children hear the smaller sounds in words.
-  Reading is the single most important thing you can do to prepare a new reader.
-  Writing and drawing let children visually represent ideas and words. It begins with scribbling.
-  Playing is how children discover, explore and understand the world and their place in it.

### Upcoming Eclipse

Is it the sun? Is it the moon? This year on Saturday, October 14<sup>th</sup> you can look up (with appropriate protection for your eyes) and see both during an annular eclipse. This type of eclipse happens when the moon is farther away from the Earth than normal and a bit smaller than the sun, and Cedar Mill will be very close to the path of totality. Both Cedar Mill and Bethany Libraries will have a limited supply of eclipse glasses to give away beginning Tuesday, September 5<sup>th</sup>.
